In collaboration with the Ombili Foundation, Onguma has curated a self-drive cultural experience that offers insight into the current lives and past traditions and customs of the San people and their rich heritage. This tour provides a meaningful and educational encounter while supporting the important community work at the Ombili Foundation.

ACTIVITIES INCLUDED

- **Welcome & introduction to the Ombili Foundation**
- **Guided visit to:**
 - Garden
 - Mais-Rische Heim Private Hostel
 - Workshop
 - Clinic
 - Donation Wall
 - Crafts Centre
 - Anne Klein Kindergarten (during school term only)
 - Ombili Primary School and Otjolo
 - Olakula and Nepara Villages
- **Bushman Trail** (45-60 minutes; 1.5 kilometres)
 - Traditional San medicinal plants
 - Food foraged from the Bush
 - Natural hunting poisons and traps
 - Indigenous trees and plant uses
- **Cultural entertainment at the Ombili Culture Centre**
 - Fire-makers and traditional dancing (dependent on community members' availability)
 - Ombili Community Choir (dependent on community members' availability)
 - Informal get-together with refreshments and conversations with San residents
- **Opportunity to purchase handmade crafts and baskets**



DETAILS

- **Duration:** approximately 2.5 hours at the Ombili Foundation
 - **Location:** 1 hour's drive from Onguma, near Tsumeb (Farm Hedwigslust No. 307).
 - **Cost:** N\$ 750 per person
- Payment made directly to Ombili in cash is preferred. Alternatively, tour operators may pay Onguma on behalf of their guests, or guests may charge the experience to their Onguma account, with all proceeds going directly to the Foundation.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- This is available to self-drive guests only. Guests are responsible for their own transport to and from Ombili Foundation.
- Directions can be provided.
- The schools will not be in session on weekends or during school holidays.
- Availability of community performances depends on the availability of members on the day of the visit.
- The preferred method of payment at Ombili is cash. While card payments may be possible, this is not guaranteed. If guests do not have cash, they can bill the experience to their Onguma guest account, to be settled before departure.
- Bookings can be made via Onguma on behalf of guests.

Please note: Onguma must be informed at least one day in advance if guests plan to visit Ombili. This allows Ombili to arrange for community members to be available for the full cultural experience. If guests arrive without prior notice, they will receive the standard Ombili tour.
